

# Open the Book/ICE Torbay Newsletter

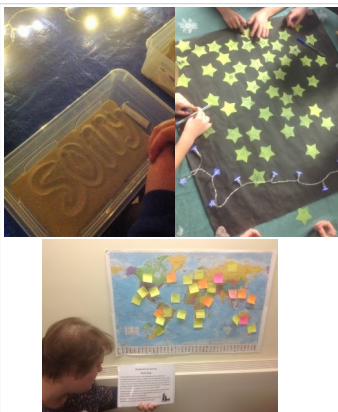

Last term we were very busy setting up new lunch clubs, running Christmas themed Prayer Spaces and starting up new Open the Book teams.

We had a great time during the first couple of weeks of December, running the Christmas themed **Prayer Spaces in Schools**, in four primary schools across Torbay. We ran Prayer Spaces in Collaton St Mary, Roselands and St Marychurch primary schools, and this year for the first time we also ran one in Tower House school, and as always, we were very encouraged to see how appreciative the head teachers were about us being there.

*'Good stories enable us to see our own life-story in new ways. These prayer activities invite students to reflect on the events and relationships in their lives, and encourages them to express their thoughts and feelings, ask questions, and if they want to, try praying.'* (Prayerspacesinschools.com)



We had six prayer stations setup, all of which encouraged the children to reflect on the Christmas story as it unfolds. As the children moved around the activities they were able to explore prayer and were given the opportunity to pray. They also learnt that 'Nothing is impossible for God', and how God tells us not to be worried or afraid, but instead to hand our concerns over to Him. The children also learned about saying sorry to God for things they'd done wrong, as well as how to ask God for guidance whenever they wish. They enjoyed making playdough models of the gifts they had received in life, (whether Christmas gifts, or gifts such as skills and talents), whilst learning about how we should always thank God for all the wonderful gifts that He has given us.

The children were very excited to experience these activities and really enjoyed learning more about the Christmas story through them.

### ICE Lunch Clubs

The ICE Lunch Clubs which we started running during autumn term have been very successful. We ran lunch clubs in St Marychurch & All Saints Babbacombe initially, then started another one up in Curledge Street Academy during November. The children had an introductory session on 'The Fruit of the Spirit', followed by three more sessions where we looked at, Love, Joy and Peace. We finished the term with an exciting Christmas session which the children really enjoyed. We intend to develop the lunch clubs further and hope to start more of them during the spring and summer terms.



### Open the Book

There are now 15 Open the Book teams in Torbay, with more schools asking for teams to start. There are also 9 teams in the South Hams, and 1 new team in Teignbridge. The teams are reaching thousands of children in the local area with Bible stories who wouldn't normally hear them.
